#### YOUTH STEM EDUCATION

Hands-on STEM workshops, offered regardless of ability to pay, introducing classrooms on the southwest side to indoor aquaponic farming.

#### INDOOR VICTORY GARDEN

Our one of a kind space for Chicagoans to learn how to grow food indoors year-round.

#### **LOCAL FOOD ACCESS**

Low-cost boxes of local produce offered to our neighbors on the southwest side of Chicago.

- \$500 supports two hands-on STEM workshops for one classroom




- \$2,000 supports a paid sustainability internship for a local youth ages 16-24
